### **Girl Scout Cadettes/Seniors/Ambassadors**

#### Membership

A Girl Scout Cadette troop is comprised of girls who are in grades 6, 7, & 8. A Girl Scout Senior troop is comprised of girls who are in grades 9 & 10, and a Girl Scout Ambassador troop is comprised of girls who are in grades 11 & 12. Girls with developmental challenges should be registered as closely as possible with girls of their chronological age.

### Reflections

Think of ways you might describe girls in a typical Girl Scout Cadette, Senior, or Ambassador troop. List 3 or 4 characteristics typical of this age Girl Scout. What qualities in girls do you most value and which qualities in girls do you least value?

List characteristics you need to know more about – or those which could be problematic. Do you think you consistently reward the behavior you value most? How must you need to change your reaction to some behaviors in girls? You may discover that your values about girls' behaviors and qualities differ from theirs. How will you respond to those differences as your work with girls and their adult partners?

# **Girl Scout Cadette/Senior/Ambassador Meetings**

Look at the sample sessions in the *aMAZE!*, *GIRLtopia*, or *Your Voice Your World adult guide* and other Girl Scout resources and make some tentative plans. Balance your year's program with the following suggestions:

- Involve girls in using their Journey books and other resources to complete activities about themselves, others, safety and skill.
- Include service projects.
- Plan field trips that enhance program activities.
- Help the girls plan bridging activities.
- Participate in Neighborhood activities.
- Include some activities at a Council camp.
- Participate in Council activities see Program at a Glance.
- Participate in a summer activity.

The most important thing to remember is GIRL/adult planning.
